

## Patrick Beilein to Coach at WV Wesleyan

Former WVU basketball player and son of former WVU coach John Beilein has been named head basketball coach at West Virginia Wesleyan. Beilein had been serving as director of basketball operations at Bradley University.

Patrick played high school basketball here in Richmond at Benedictine High School before following his father to WVU as a player. His father John was head coach at the University of Richmond before taking the same position at WVU.

Patrick scored over 1,000 points, including 242 three-point shots, in his WVU career and was a member of teams that advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen and Elite Eight.

## WVU vs. Alabama In 2014

#### Teams to Meet in Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game



WVU will meet Alabama for the first time on the gridiron to open the 2014 season in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta on Saturday, August 30, 2014.

"Alabama and West Virginia are consistently among the premier teams in the country and we're thrilled to be able to host such a high profile game with representatives from the SEC and the Big 12," said Gary Stokan, Chick-fil-A Bowl president and CEO. "This will be an epic blockbuster-type

game the nation will anticipate for a long, long time and will continue our tradition of showcasing two top-ranked teams to open the season on Saturday night."

Tickets to the game will be evenly split between the two teams, creating a true neutral-site game. All tickets to the game will be sold through the university ticket offices. No tickets will be sold through the Chick-fil-A Bowl office.

"I believe that playing an opponent that has the national reputation that West Virginia does, one of the top programs in the country, provides a great challenge for our players and gives us something to look forward to in the offseason," said Nick Saban, Alabama head coach.

West Virginia is 24-22-2 all time against teams from the SEC and defeated Georgia to win the 2006 Sugar Bowl the year it was played in Atlanta's Georgia Dome, site of the game with Alabama.

"Playing in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game is a great opportunity for our football program and will be an exciting event for our fans," said Dana Holgorsen, West Virginia head coach. "Alabama is one of the top teams in college football history, and it will be a tough challenge for us."

"Playing in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game is yet another great way to showcase our football program on a national stage," Director of Athletics Oliver Luck said. "Playing Alabama will match-up two programs with great college football traditions. I have known Nick Saban since my playing days at West Virginia, and I have the utmost respect for him and his program."
